Thoughts from Pastor Judson

A few weeks ago Pr. Cassie, Connie Lindler, Pat Allen and I traveled to Oklahoma City for the NALC's Lutheran Week. The theme for this gathering was *Missio Dei: The Work & Mission of God.* It was good to see colleagues, to re-elect Rev. Dan Selbo to a second term as Bishop, and to hear of how God is at work in the church and world. Reflecting back on the week as a whole, I am still struck by the worship. Our theme verse from Mark 16 resonated through our worship:

¹⁵ And Jesus said to them, "Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation." (Mar 16:15 ESV)

In keeping with this theme, our various liturgies included Service of the Word, On Fire for Mission Bible Studies, Commissioning of Global Workers, Prayer of Thanksgiving, and closed with a service of Holy Communion with the Rite of Installation of a Bishop. Each of us in attendance have now carried this theme back to our respective congregations and countries, and so the *Missio Dei*, the Work of God, has indeed been shared globally.

As we continue to worship here at St. Peter's, we continue to proclaim the Gospel not only within the walls of the sanctuary but outside the walls as well. This includes providing Flood Buckets, Snack Shack, School Supplies, our Youth Mission trip, etc. I could fill this article with a whole list of things we do/have done. But the reality is it isn't truly things we have done. God is at work, in each of us to carry on his mission in the world. That is our calling here at St. Peter's, as part of the NALC, and even more on a global scale.

Ministry Highlights

Church Council met August 13th @ 6 pm. Absent: Debbie Dent, Ed Hedgecock, and Mike Weidner

- Evaluations were done on both pastors.
- Treasurer's report is great! As of the end of July, we are \$11,103.81 over our spending for the year. Praise the Lord!
- **Education** is planning to offer a couple of trips. Women's Ministry has a few fun things planned for the congregation. A lot of work continues on the Library & the Archives.
- Evangelism is planning to host breakfast & introduce the new members that joined at the end of June. T-shirts are being researched bearing our new church logo. Ongoing discussions are being held about spreading the Gospel through signs & billboards.
- Kitchen folks are keeping a check on paper supplies. Landis will check with contractor this week since we accepted the contract four months ago, so we should be next.
- Property will handle updating the church sign on the corner now that the traffic circle is complete. Nursery hall carpet will be replaced with laminate flooring. Road from the Gazebo to the Scout Hut and to the storage shed will be resurfaced. Recycled asphalt will be used.
- Safety helped with VBS and is expecting installation of additional keypads at the end of August.
- Scouts collected 20 bags of trash & mattress.
- Service delivered 104 lbs. of people food & 207 bags of pet food to Mission Lexington. VBS packed over 200 health kits for disaster relief.

Endowment Board

You may wonder—why should I also give to the SPLC Endowment Fund?

Give because a contribution to the Endowment Fund is an amazing gift that is never used up. Your gift is added to the balance of the fund, and the Fund grows. As the Fund grows, the annual distribution increases, enabling the ministries of the SPLC to increase. And far into the future, when we can't know what the appropriate ministries will be, the future church leaders will make decisions based on current needs, and your gift will be part of that future ministry. After other gifts have been expended, the Endowment Fund continues to provide a reminder of the faith and witness of its donors. That is reason to give.

The purpose of our Endowment is to provide continuing financial support for the ministries of SPLC in perpetuity. Ministries can include, but are not limited to, the funding of missions, capital additions and improvements, and special programs. Endowment distributions go to purposes that are not covered by the church's annual budget.

The annual Endowment distribution amount is determined by a formula designed to continually preserve the market value of the Fund. The investment policy and the distribution methodology, both part of the Policy, work together to ensure that the Fund will always be growing, even though distributions are made annually to support SPLC's ministries.

How can you give to the Endowment Fund? You can give a gift of any amount to the Endowment Fund today. Simply write a check and mark it for the Endowment Fund. If you like, your gift can be in honor or in memory of someone.

You may want to make a gift of appreciated securities. A gift of appreciated securities has added tax benefits because you do not have to pay the income tax on the capital gain that you would owe if you sold the stock. Call the church office to find out how to transfer the stock directly from your account to the Endowment Fund account.

You can also leave a gift to the Endowment Fund through your will. A gift from a lifetime of accumulated wealth may often be your largest single contribution. Your attorney can write an amendment to your will that includes a bequest to the SPLC Endowment Fund.



Cheese Ball by Letha Long

2 (8 oz.) cream cheese 2 cups nuts, chopped

1 can crushed pineapple, drained 2 Tbsp. minced onion, chopped

1/4 cup bell pepper, chopped 1 Tbsp. seasoning salt

Combine all ingredients except 1 cup nuts. Mix well & roll into 2 balls. Let stand overnight in icebox. Use remaining cup of nuts to roll balls in.

Chili Cheese Ball by Bobbie Schneider

1 (1 lb.) pkg. cream cheese 3 Tbsp. salsa

1 envelope dry chili mix

Mix together well and pat into ball. Roll in pecans. Serve with crackers.

Party Mix by Ann Rowell

1 box Cheerios 1 box Wheat Chex 1/4 c. Worcestershire Sauce

1 pkg. Pretzels
1 lb. peanuts
2 c. Wesson Oil
1 box Rice Chex
1 Tbsp. garlic salt
1 Tbsp. onion salt

1 lb. pecans 1 Tbsp. celery salt

Combine all. Cook for 1 hour (covered). Cook for additional hour (uncovered). Stir occasionally. Cook at 250°.
