# St. Peter's By the Numbers

It's that time of year again where Pr. Cassie & I have to compile the parochial information of the parish & send it to the Bishop's office. I look at this time as a perfect time to also see where we have been, and to see if any trends are visible within our ministries. I was pleasantly surprised this year, and although I know I have shared this with some of you, here are the trends that I found to be the most pertinent as we move through 2024.

Attendance (includes Ash Wednesday & Holy Week Services):

2022 Average: 200 / Sunday 2023 Average: 224 / Sunday

2024 Average: 238 / Sunday (251 without Ash Wed.)

**Giving** (All Funds, not just General Fund):

2022: \$571,043.50 (January only \$39,320.18) 2023: \$791,947.58 (January only \$57,697.57)

2024: January = \$58,870.85

Some specific 2024 items so far:

- **★ Soup Supper:** 250+ in attendance. We ran out of soup, sandwiches, and many side dishes.
- ★ Shrove Tuesday: We prepared for 275 & ran out of food! We counted approximately 290 plates served.

As I look at these numbers, they are an indication of 1) a healthy congregation and 2) a ministry-driven congregation (both inside & outside of the church). That is a blessing & we all should celebrate what the Spirit is doing in this place! Furthermore, we have several things upcoming that will continue this momentum.

Mini-Music Camp: April 13 (10 am—Noon) New Member Lunch & Learn: April 21 Music Camp: May 4-5 (more info soon!)



In the Lutheran Book of Worship<sup>1</sup>, the rite of Holy Baptism asks parents and the church body to make promises. We promise to "faithfully bring children to the services of God's House, to place in their hands the Holy Scriptures, and provide for their instruction in the Christian faith." We also promise to "Faithfully care for them and help in every way, as God gives you opportunity, that they may bear witness to the faith we profess, living in the covenant of their baptism and in communion with the Church."

How well do we keep these promises? More importantly, how can we keep these promises? Can anything really be more important than our children's lives?

God never breaks his promises. Romans 4:13<sup>2</sup> tells us, "For the promise to Abraham and his offspring that he would be heir of the world did not come through the law but through the righteousness of faith."

Hebrews 6:13<sup>2</sup> reminds us "So when God desired to show more convincingly to the heirs of the promise the unchangeable character of his purpose, he guaranteed it with an oath."


