


We will also be collecting donations of Breakfast Foods—Pancake Mix, Cereals, Protein Bars, Grits, Oatmeal—for Mission Lexington.

A-H brings Sandwiches I-P brings Salads Q-Z brings Desserts


We will have some fun entertainment from our music department including some things you might not hear from us on a Sunday morning. It's a chance for us to let our hair down...except for Barry, of course.


