From Death to Life

It's Monday, October 21. I'm sitting at my desk after having just made a visit to a member that is expected to enter the Church Triumphant soon. On the way to that visit, Pr. Cassie and I had a brief phone call about 2 baptisms that we have upcoming. On my left, my hymnbook is open to page 120 (Rite of Holy Baptism). On my right, my LBW Occasional Services Book (the small liturgical book Pr. Cassie & I use for home communions, funerals, etc.) is open to the Funeral Liturgy. Here I sit in the middle and the reminder that this is what life looks like. We live between baptism & eternal life, both of which are solely by & for God.

In Romans 6:3-5, St. Paul writes: *"Do you not know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we were buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we also might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his."*

The earthly journey that we all walk is one that begins at baptism. This journey is complete when we enter into the Church Triumphant and join our God in eternal life in his kingdom. Emphasis on baptism hasn't always been the norm in the church. The Rev. Phillip Pfatteicher stated in his book *Commentary on the Lutheran Book of Worship* (Augsburg Fortress, 1990) that this emphasis "began with Luther himself." Luther's emphasis on baptism came from his own education in the theology of St. Augustine. Augustine is famous for describing a sacrament as a "visible word" because the Word of God comes to the element of the sacrament. This is God's work on earth visible to all those that see it. In the sacrament of baptism, we are marked with the cross of Christ forever. A visible sign that God can see eternally. The sacrament of baptism is therefore instituted by Christ as a means of grace for the church & by which God's Word is accomplished in & through such a visible element. It is this sacrament, this holy work by God, that forms the foundation that guides & informs everything we do in life. In Matthew 28 Jesus gives us the great commission, telling us to go, make disciples, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, & Holy Spirit, & teaching them to obey what he has commanded. Celebrating our baptism on a continual basis is a reminder to us that we have been given a holy and precious gift...the gift of Salvation that can only come from God. Walking in the covenant of our baptism, let us strive to do what Jesus has asked of us each & every day, so God may be glorified & we may rejoice in the gift of life.

Proposed By-Law Changes

Cemetery: The cemetery committee recommends revision to by-laws Section Eight, Item 13

Proposed

The Cemetery committee reserves the right to remove from graves dead or faded flowers, unsightly broken or tattered items. Loose items should not be placed in the grass but should be placed on the Monument base. Lighted items are discouraged. Live plants may not be planted within the cemetery boundary. Digging holes for flower pots is prohibited. All flowers should be placed in appropriate containers (no glass). They should be placed in the granite holders or metal pot holders. Wire hooks should be used to anchor free standing flowers to stabilize the container Any seasonal items left over an extended period of time will be removed. A disposal container is

located at the gate for trash you wish to discard.

Current

The cemetery committee reserves the right to remove from graves any flowers or materials which have become unsightly. Live plants, flowers, shrubs, and trees are prohibited from being planted within the boundary of the cemetery.
