Thoughts from Pastor Judson

It's been a great 5 months together! You all are learning me and I am learning you! If you haven't figured it out yet, there are some things I do a little "different". Just chalk it up to the fact that for me, ministry is fun and enjoyable. In Ecclesiastes 3 we find the following words:

¹⁰I have seen the business that God has given to the children of man to be busy with. ¹¹He has made everything beautiful in its time. Also, he has put eternity into man's heart, yet so that he cannot find out what God has done from the beginning to the end. ¹²I perceived that there is nothing better for them than to be joyful and to do good as long as they live; ¹³also that everyone should eat and drink and take pleasure in all his toil--this is God's gift to man.

These few verses sum up ministry for me. In times of joy, sorrow, celebration, and grief ministry is present. And in all those times God is very present, and our comfort comes from his presence. As the church we minister to each other in all those moments, which reminds me of our call to pray. Those of you that get emails from me regarding prayer requests know that I always use the word "Oremus" as the subject. Oremus is Latin for "Let us pray." We all get bombarded with emails every day, many of which we just delete. But if you see the subject "Oremus", you know that is it an email you need to read because the church is being asked to pray. Another Latin word that I will often end an email with is "Pax". Pax is Latin for "peace". The church is steeped in our Latin tradition, and although we do not worship using only the Latin text anymore, using Latin occasionally is a reminder of our roots and our connection to not only the whole church catholic, but to all the saints that have gone before us. Regarding email, one more note about email etiquette...a question generates a response. If I email you and don't ask a question, know that you are welcome to reply but it isn't needed. If I do ask a question and you don't reply, then I know to follow up with you the next time I see you. It's a habit I developed many years ago that helps with communication.

One more question I get often also is about the three letters "STS" following my name. This too has a Latin connection. In 2010, I subscribed to The Rule of the pan-Lutheran Ministerium *Societas Trinitatis Sanctae* (Society of the Holy Trinity). The Rule is a document formulated by orthodox pastors in 1997 for the purpose of holding each other accountable to the vows that we as pastors made at ordination. To be a subscriber to The Rule means that we

Topic: Construction of the original "Lake Murray" Dam

Ray Ammarrell has B.S. and M.S. degrees in Civil Engineering from the University of South Carolina and is a Registered Professional engineer in South Carolina. He has bee with SCE&G (now Dominion Energy) for over 29 years and is currently Manager of Dam Safety and Hydro Compliance. His experience includes overseeing engineering, permitting, and quality control activities for the Saluda Dam Remediation Project, working in relicensing, dam safety, and FERC license compliance at the hydro facilities and managing the decommissioning and demolition of Canady's Generating Station in Colleton County, SC.

Ray's presentation will cover the construction of the original Saluda (Dreher Shoals) Dam and the Saluda Backup Dam, along with information on the licensing and operation of the Saluda Hydro Project.

Ray is also looking at the original land owner "Option" database to see if we can locate the possible area or cemetery location of the Meetze and Scott families that are buried under the lake and this may give us an idea of where the original church buildings may have been located on 18-Mile Creek. This area is believed to be off Old Chapin Road NW of Governor's Grant where 18-Mile Creek flowed to the Saluda River. We're hoping there will be something from the landowner at the time that the land option was purchased prior to flooding the lake. No promised, but he's going to check to see if that record exists.





- WHY are you so obsessed with saving money? I feel we need to be good stewards of the gifts and resources God has provided for us to use here at St. Peter's. To that end, if we can reuse or recycle something to save a little money, then I think we should.

This month we are featuring one of the favorite desserts from one of our recent "family" gatherings.

Jenny's Honey Bars (Jenny is not a member of Loving Group, but has kin folk that are.)

1 cup sugar

2 cups plain flour

1 tsp. baking soda

1 1/2 tsp. cinnamon

1/2 tsp. salt

2/3 oil

1/4 cup honey

1 egg

1/2 cup nuts (optional

Glaze (optional)

1 cup confectioners' sugar

1 Tbl. Mayonnaise

1 Tbl. Milk

1 tsp. vanilla

Combine & pour over warm cake. Spread with spatula. Let cool. Cut into bars.

Preheat oven to 350° . Mix all dry ingredients in a bowl, add oil, egg, and honey, then nuts. Mix well. It will be very thick. Bake in a 9x13 glass pan for 15-18 minutes. Cool. Then cut into squares.


