## A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR BILL

Just in case you did not know: I talked a few weeks ago in my sermon about the reoccurrence of my cancer. We have received lots of cards, texts, and phone calls from dear members with prayers and thoughts – we sincerely appreciate your love and support.

On May 6th I had a PET scan that revealed there is a tumor, previously undiscovered, in my abdomen and several new 'spots' on my liver. I am now under the care of a doctor at Duke who specializes in Neuroendocrine carcinoid cancer. The treatment plan is, I am now taking Lanreotide shots once a month at SCOA in Columbia. (I also took some in 2017 when this cancer was first found.) I will return to Duke on August 17th for scans and lab work to see if these shots are possibly shrinking, or at least stopping the growth of these tumors. Although there are side effects from these shots, so far it has not hindered my ability to fulfill my duties as your senior pastor, to which we are thankful to God. Cheryl and I feel privileged to be serving our Lord by serving St Peter's congregation. Turning to God's Holy Word, Psalm 46:1 says: "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble." Your prayers are appreciated; we know God is in control.

God loves you and I do too.
